Executive Summary

- 1. We've prepared the final draft Child Poverty Related Indicators (CPRI) report for your approval (at **Attachment A**).
- 2. The report reflects feedback received through agency consultation, Ministerial consultation and consultation with selected external stakeholders (the Salvation Army, the Office of the Children's Commissioner, Christians Against Poverty, and Pou Tangata). The Child Poverty Action Group declined the offer to provide feedback on a draft version of the report.
- The feedback was largely positive and there were no significant concerns with the substantive interpretations of the evidence outlined in the report. Stakeholders especially liked the inclusion of quotes from children at the start of each chapter to better reflect the lived experience of poverty.
- 4. A key theme of the feedback was that it is encouraging to see that some of the indicators are showing a longer-term improving trend (including in some instances for priority populations) while noting that marked disparities continue for priority groups on most of the indicators.
- 5. There was widespread support for the proposed change to the Housing Affordability indicator so that it is more focussed on low-income households.
- 6. Some stakeholders, notably the Children's Commissioner and Pou Tangata, encouraged the Government to continue, as part of the response to the wider Review of the Child and Youth Wellbeing Strategy, to develop and embed te ao Māori concepts of wellbeing, underpinned by a sound Te Tiriti analysis. We are committed to working with stakeholders to evolve our approach to CPRI reporting in line with this recommendation from the Strategy review.
- 7. In our most recent advice to you about the CPRI report [DPMC-2022/23-1464 refers] you agreed to the Gazette notice seeking to change the Housing Affordability indicator, noting that this change would come in to effect for the CPRI report for the 2022/23 financial year to be published in 2024.
- 8. We note that in our earlier incoming Minister's briefing to you, and in advice to the previous Minister for Child Poverty Reduction, we incorrectly stated that this change would not come into effect until the 2023/24 financial year, published in 2025.
- 9. This year's CPRI report must be published, and you are required to present the report to Parliament, before the end of June. We intend to publish the report in the week beginning 12 June, with the exact date to be confirmed in discussion with your office and depending on any final feedback you may wish to provide.
